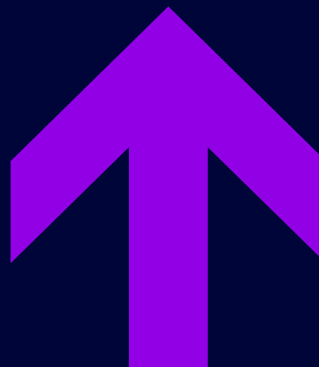


## **How often do you get to cure your patients of a disease?**
